

The **POA** consists of one rep from each of the 25 villages of Aberdeen, and a representative for the Country Club. POA meetings are the first **Thursday** of the month in the East Ballroom. Both meetings are open to all Aberdeen East residents and attended by our Campbell Property Manager.

The **House Committee** meets..... in the Clubhouse the Monday **meeting** before the East meeting and sets up the Agenda for the upcoming meeting.

Below is a clever scam as explained by the victim.

I had a call from "Express Couriers" (could be any courier) asking if I would be home since there was a package that required my signature. He said a delivery would arrive at my home in an hour. Sure enough, an hour later, a uniformed delivery man arrived with a beautiful basket of flowers and a bottle of wine.

I was surprised since there was no special occasion and I wasn't expecting anything. I inquired who the sender was and the courier replied, "I don't know, I'm only delivering the package." Apparently, a greeting card was being sent separately (which never arrived). Because the gift contained alcohol, there was a \$3.50 "delivery-verification charge," proving that he delivered the package to an adult of legal drinking age, and not just left on the doorstep where it could be taken by anyone, especially a minor.

This was logical and I offered to pay cash. He said the delivery company required payment by credit or debit card so that everything is accounted for and keeping this a legal transaction. He added, "Couriers don't carry cash to avoid loss or targets for robbery." My spouse gave the "delivery man" a credit card and he swiped it on a small mobile card machine with a screen and keypad. My husband was asked to enter his PIN number. We were given a receipt of the transaction and told everything was in order.

Over the next few days, \$4,000 was charged/withdrawn from our credit/debit account at various ATM machines. The "mobile credit card machine" the deliveryman carried now had all the info necessary to create "dummy" cards with our details including the PIN number. We notified the bank which issued us a new card, and our account was closed. The police confirmed it was a scam since several households had been hit.

Be wary of accepting any "surprise gift or package" which you neither expected nor ordered, especially if it involves any kind of payment as a condition of receiving the gift. Never accept anything if there is not identification of the sender. Only give personal credit/debit card info when you yourself initiated the purchase.




BOOK CLUB NEWS


